Week 2 This month marks the birthday of Alexander Graham Bell, the famous inventor and scientist who was born on 3rd March 1847 in Edinburgh, Scotland. Bell's most famous and widely recognised achievement is his invention of the telephone.

Now think about how the phone has evolved over time, and how many things do people use their phones for now. Week 3 Monday 8th March 2021 is International Women's Day. It is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating women's equality. This year's theme is 'Choosing to Challenge' and asks all of us to choose to call out inequality when we see it, and to seek out and celebrate the achievements of women.

The rest of the day was quite easy.


I did all the jobs on my list
